## **Physical and Behavioral Indicators of Abuse**

Type of Abuse	Physical Indicators	Behavioral Indicators
Physical Abuse	<ol> <li>Unexplained bruises (in various stages of healing).</li> <li>Unexplained burns, especially cigarette burns or immersion burns.</li> <li>Unexplained fractures, lacerations or abrasions.</li> <li>Swollen areas.</li> <li>Evidence of delayed or inappropriate treatment for injuries.</li> </ol>	1) Self destructive. 2) Withdrawn and/or aggressive – behavioral extremes. 3) Arrives at school early or stays late as if afraid to be at home. 4) Chronic runaway (adolescents). 5) Complains of soreness or moves uncomfortably. 6) Wears clothing inappropriate to weather to cover body. 7) Bizarre explanation of injuries. 8) Wary of adult contact.
Physical Neglect	<ol> <li>Abandonment.</li> <li>Unattended medical needs.</li> <li>Consistent lack of supervision.</li> <li>Consistent hunger, inappropriate dress and/or poor hygiene.</li> <li>Lice, distended stomach, emaciated.</li> <li>Inadequate nutrition.</li> </ol>	<ol> <li>Regularly displays fatigue or listlessness; falls asleep in class.</li> <li>Steals food; begs from students.</li> <li>Reports that no caretaker is at home.</li> <li>Frequently absent or tardy.</li> <li>Self destructive.</li> <li>School dropout (adolescents).</li> <li>Extreme loneliness and need for affection.</li> </ol>
Sexual Abuse	Sexual abuse may be non-touching; obscene language; pornography; exposure – or touching; fondling; molesting; oral sex; intercourse.  1) Torn, stained or blooding Underclothing.  2) Pain, swelling or itching in genital area.  3) Difficulty walking or sitting.  4) Bruises or bleeding in genital area.  5) Venereal disease.  6) Frequent urinary or yeast infections.	<ol> <li>Excessive seductiveness.</li> <li>Role reversal, overly concerned for siblings.</li> <li>Massive weight change.</li> <li>Suicide attempts (especially adolescents).</li> <li>Inappropriate sex play or premature understanding of sex.</li> <li>Threatened by physical contact, closeness.</li> </ol>
Emotional Abuse	Emotional abuse may be name-calling, Insults, put-downs, etc., or it may be Terrorization, isolation, humiliation, Rejection, corruption, ignoring.  1) Speech disorders.  2) Delayed physical development.  3) Substance abuse.  4) Ulcers, asthma, severe allergies.	<ol> <li>Habit disorder (sucking, rocking, biting).</li> <li>Antisocial, destructive.</li> <li>Neurotic traits (sleep disorders, inhibition of play.</li> <li>Passive and aggressive – behavioral extremes.</li> <li>Delinquent behavior (especially adolescents).</li> </ol>
